Very excited about our numbers - we exceeded our On Time girl re-registration benchmark by 27 girls, and our new girl registration number by 77! Our entire new girl goal is 160, and we've already registered 109! We are the only Service Unit in our circle to reach our first set of goals! Way to go! Thank you all for all of your hard work!

Leader Positions

Leaders, don't forget to check on your position in eBiz. You have to self-report whether you are (or want to be) the 01, 02 or 03, if you do not, you will be listed as a 14 (adult member), and your troop will not be eligible to meet or sell fall product, etc, due to lack of leadership (at least officially).

Log into eBiz, click on your name, and it will show you your roles under the heading of How I Participate. Make sure you are showing up as the correct leader position, or service unit volunteer position. You can add roles at the bottom of the list.

Question about difference between 02 & 03. Remember, your troop can function and be in compliance if you have an 01 & 02, or an 01 & 03. All three positions require the application & background check. The 01 is the leader with access to and responsibility for Troop Management in eBiz, and MUST take the required trainings (Fundamentals, Age Level Trainings). The 02 is considered a co-leader and MUST take the required trainings. The 03 is considered "another responsible adult" (like a driver or cookie dad) and doesn't need to take trainings, but can be the 2nd adult at meetings.

Surprise Guest Speaker

From Woodland Mounds; Nicole Sturgeon, a Senior in Troop 44581 and her mom Sarah, the CSA Coordinator. Nicole came to talk about the CSA Association at Council and the CSA Leadership Conference in February.
